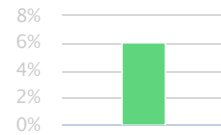

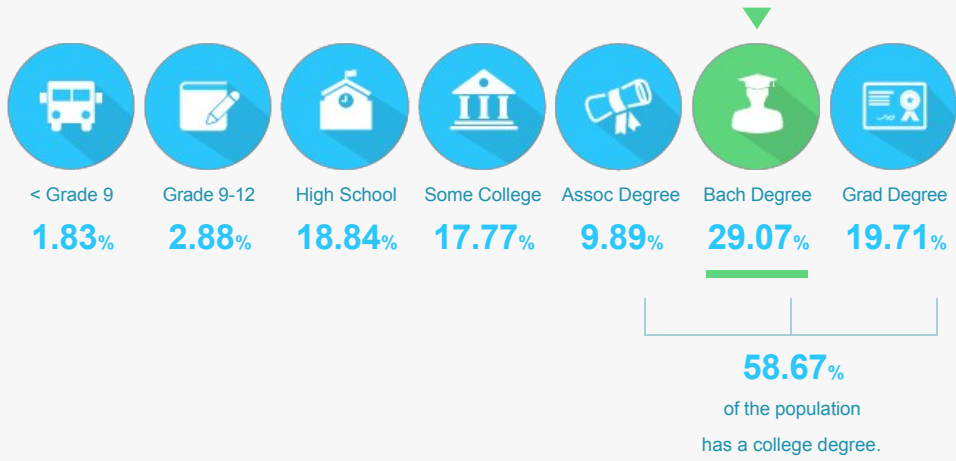

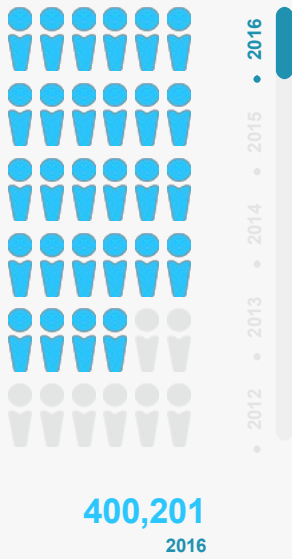


LABOR FORCE

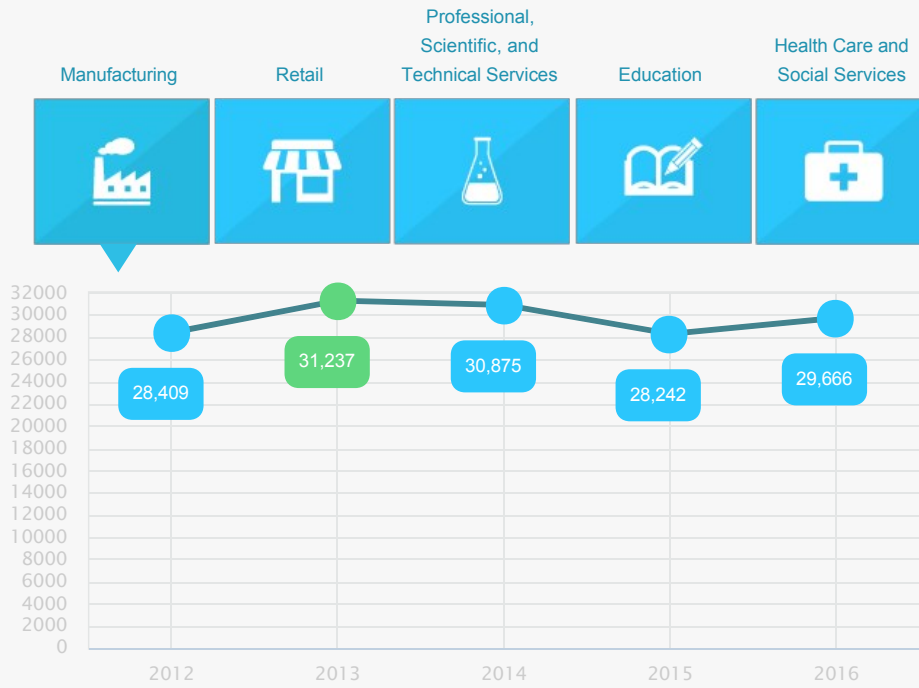

There are 42% more households who own their homes than there are renters.

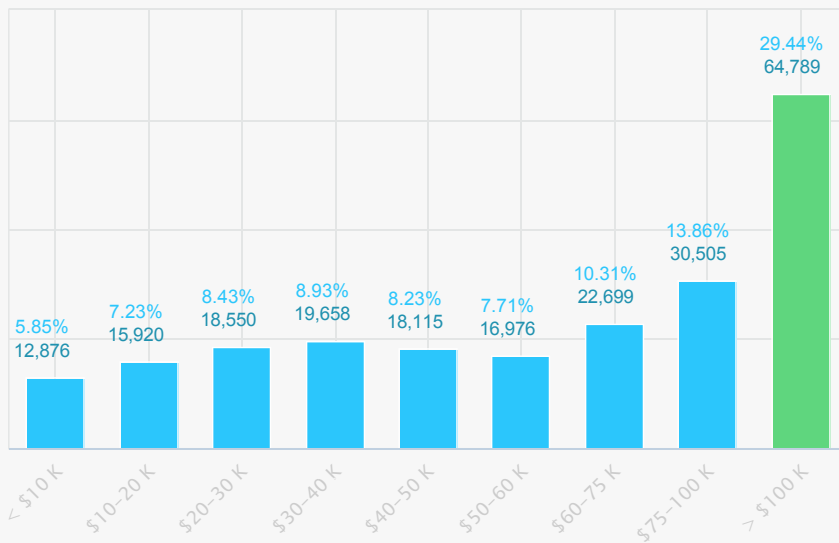

How do people spend much of their money?

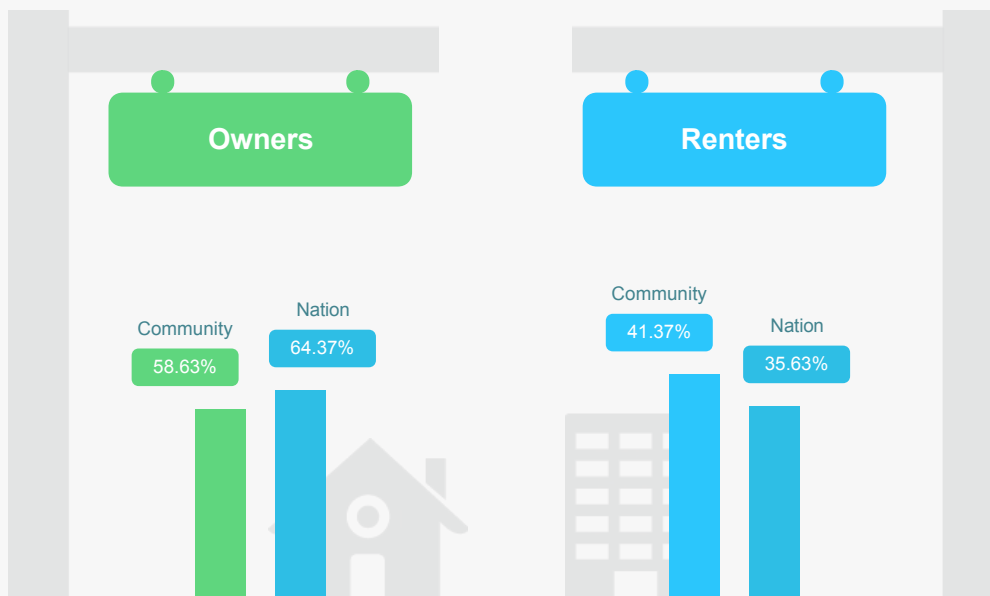

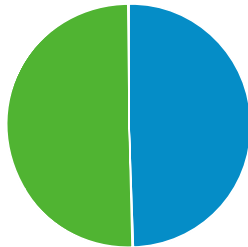

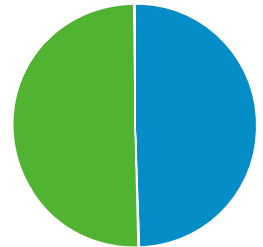

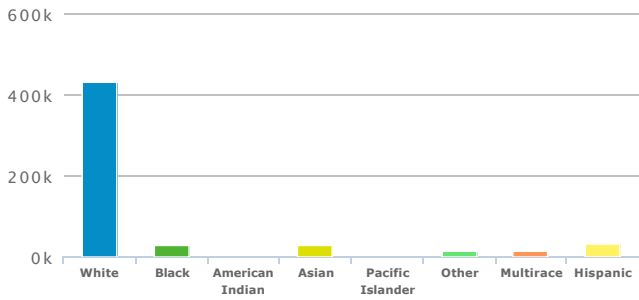

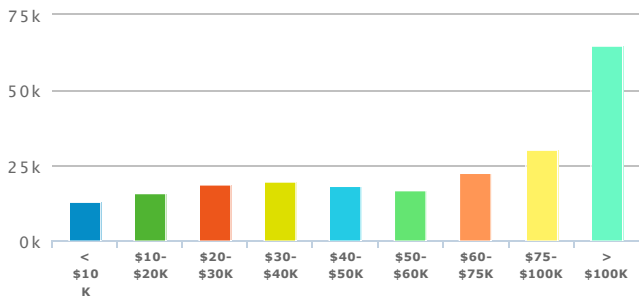

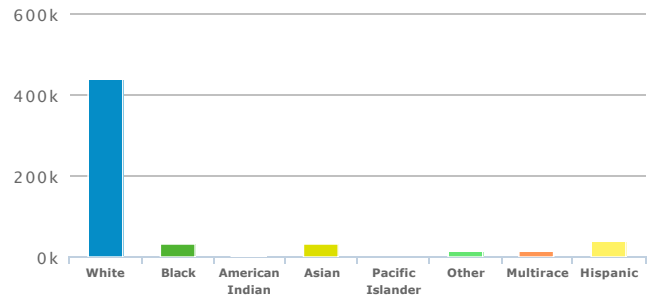

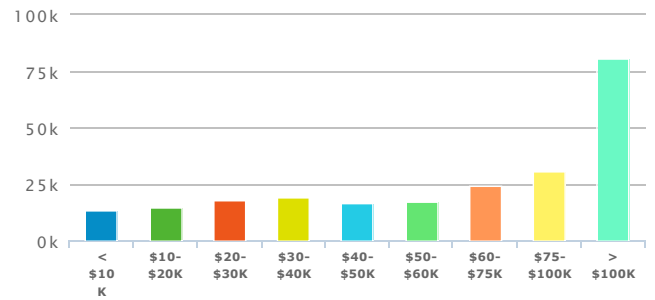

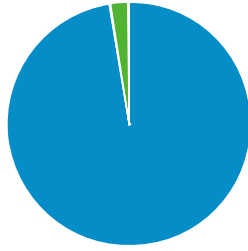

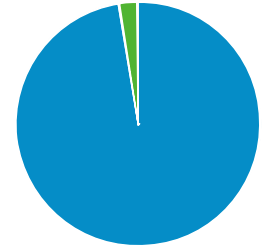

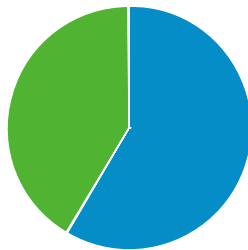

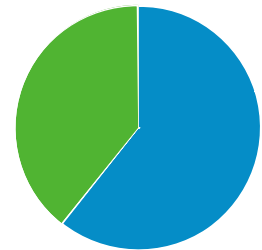
