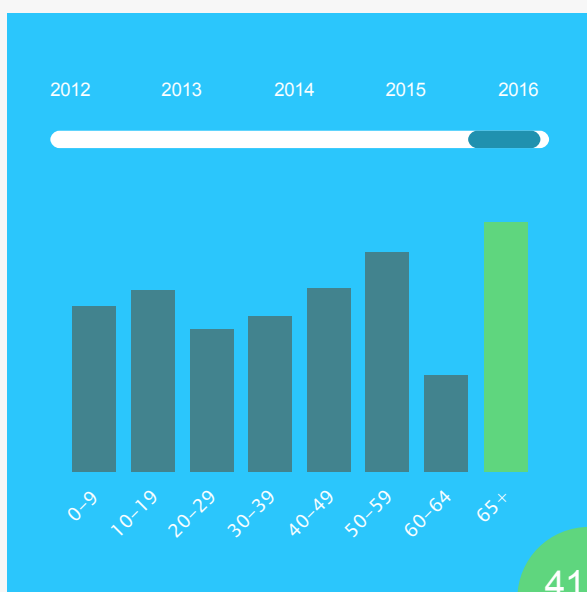
The total population of the County of Green County is 36,745. The median age is 41.86.

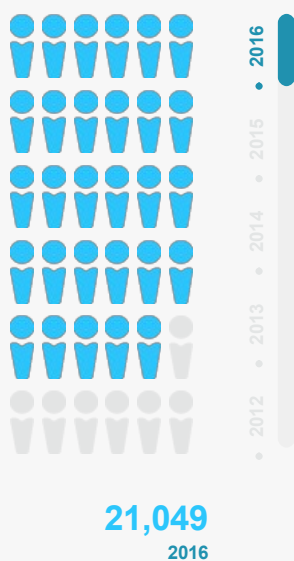

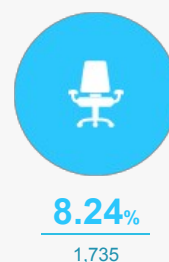

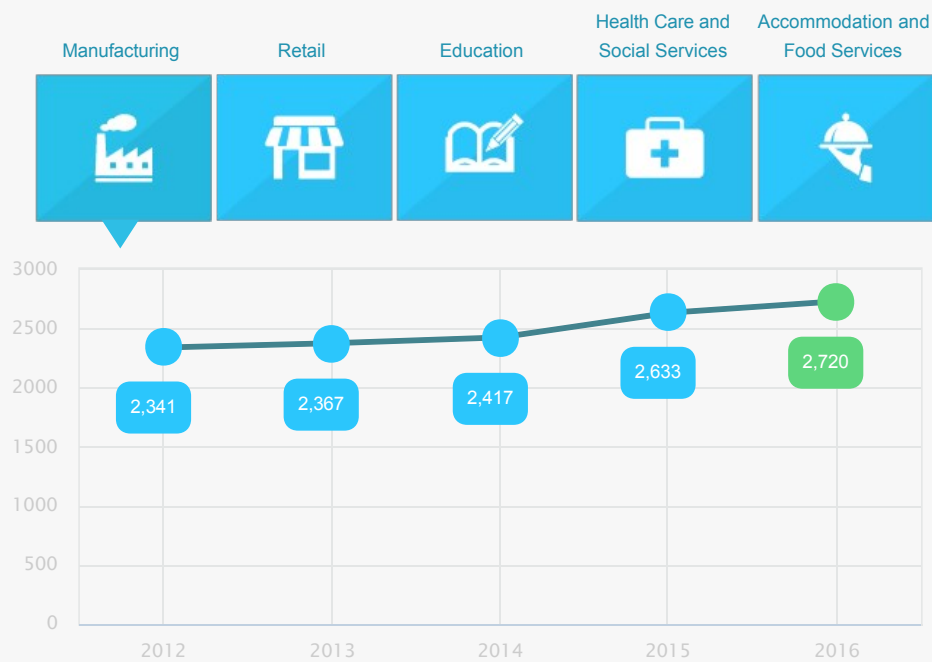

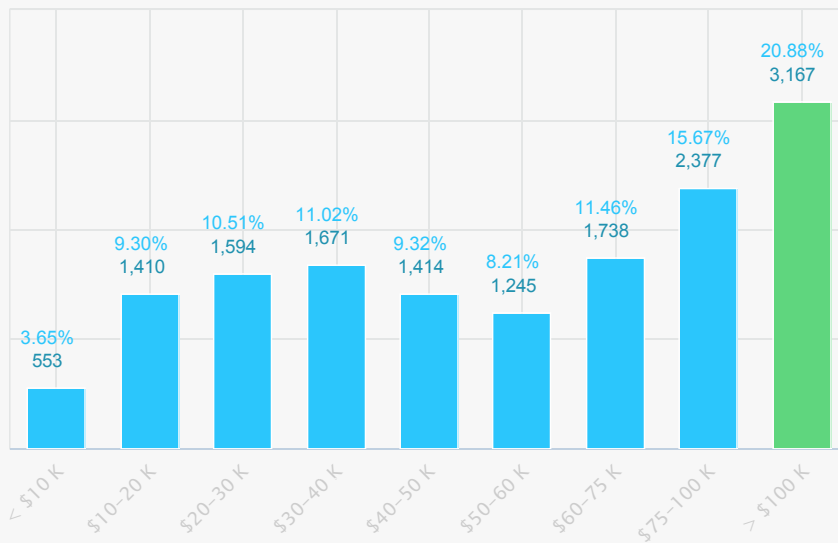

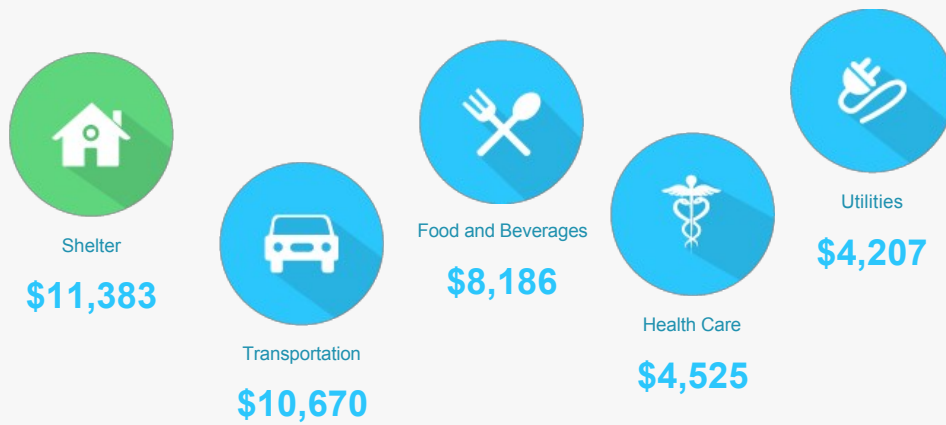

## How do people spend much of their money?

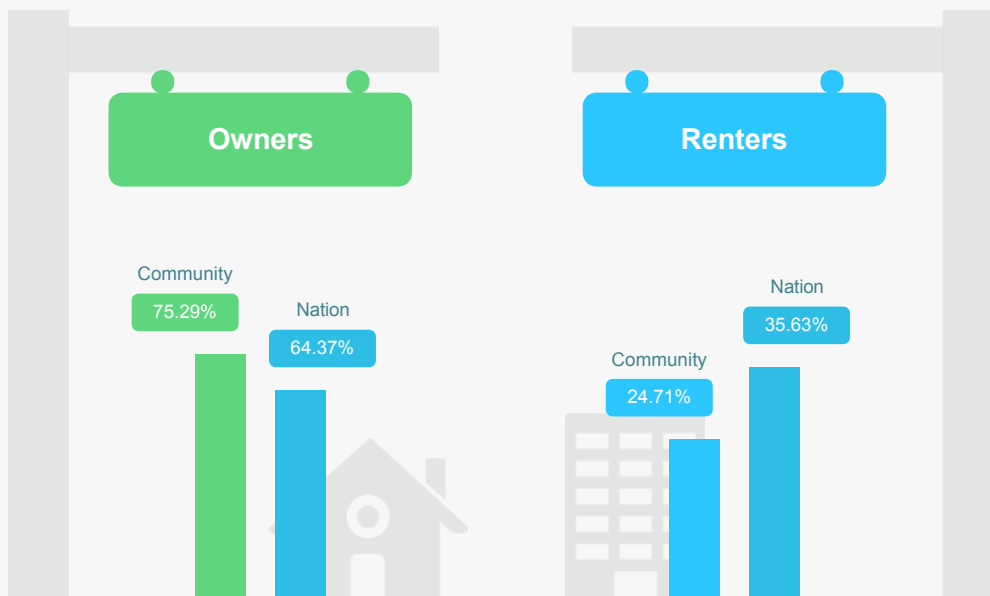

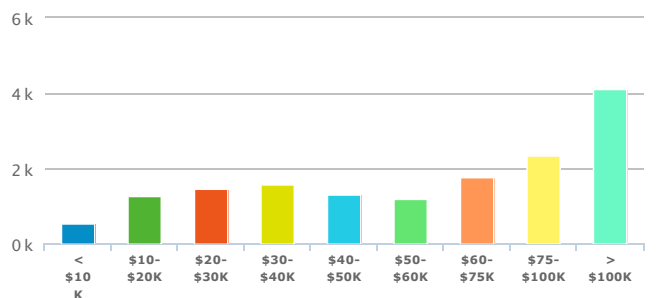

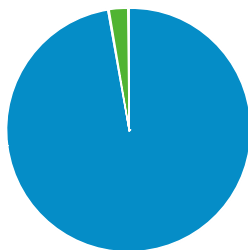
