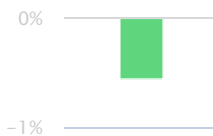

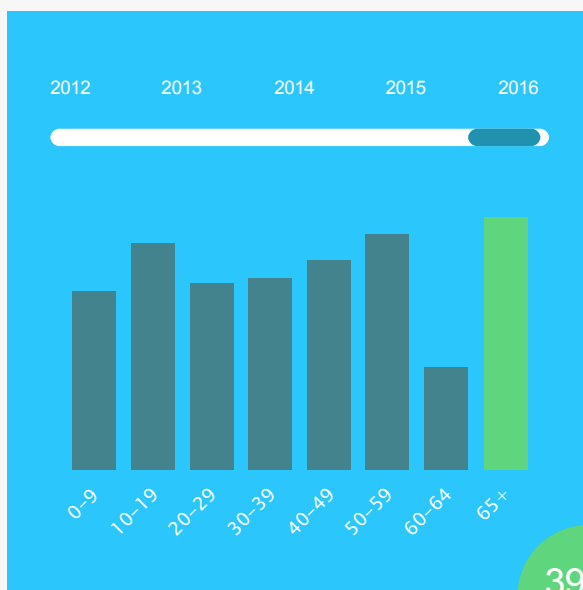
The total population of the County of Jefferson County is 83,232. The median age is 39.38.

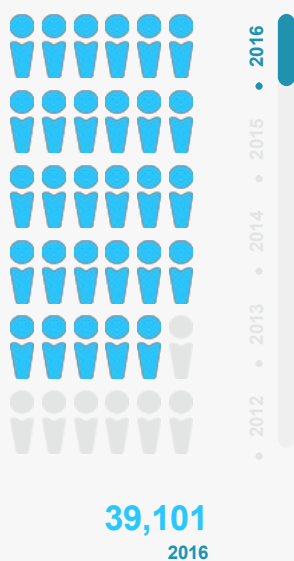

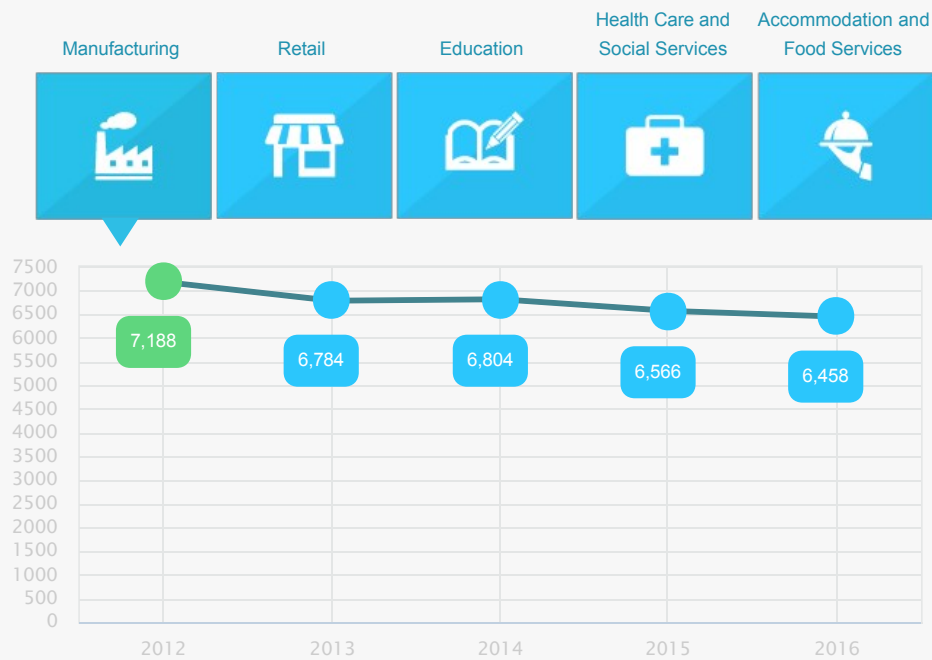

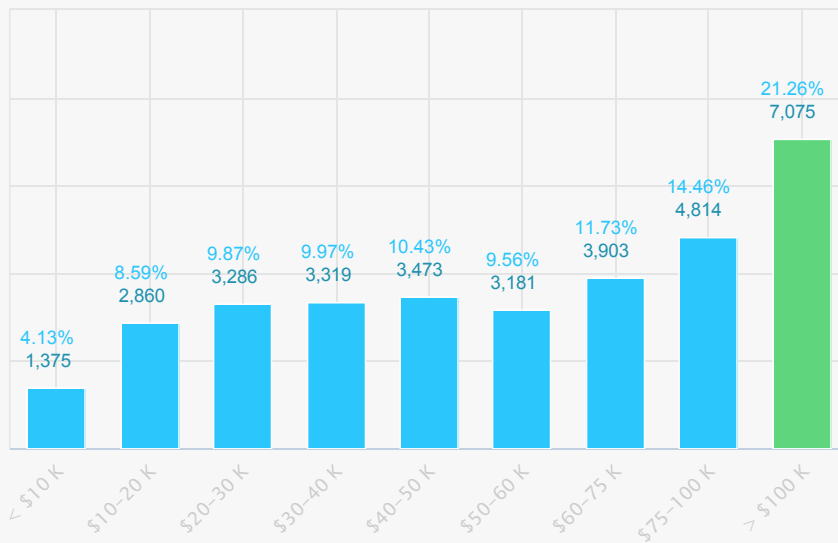

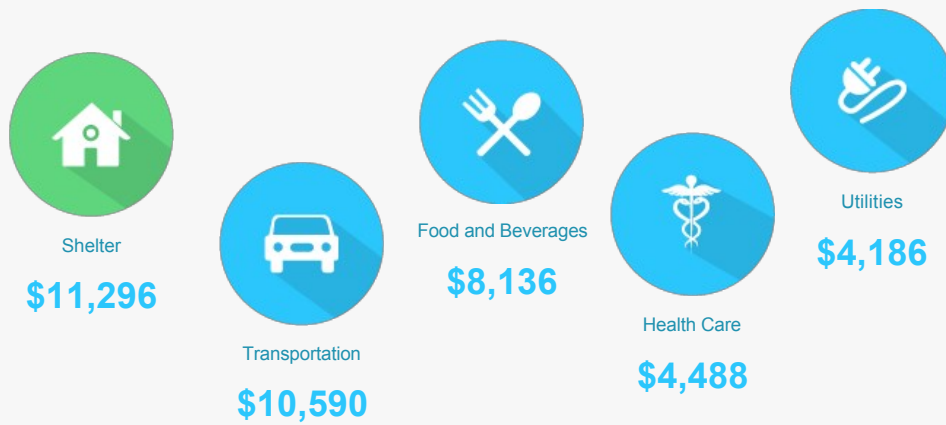

## How do people spend much of their money?

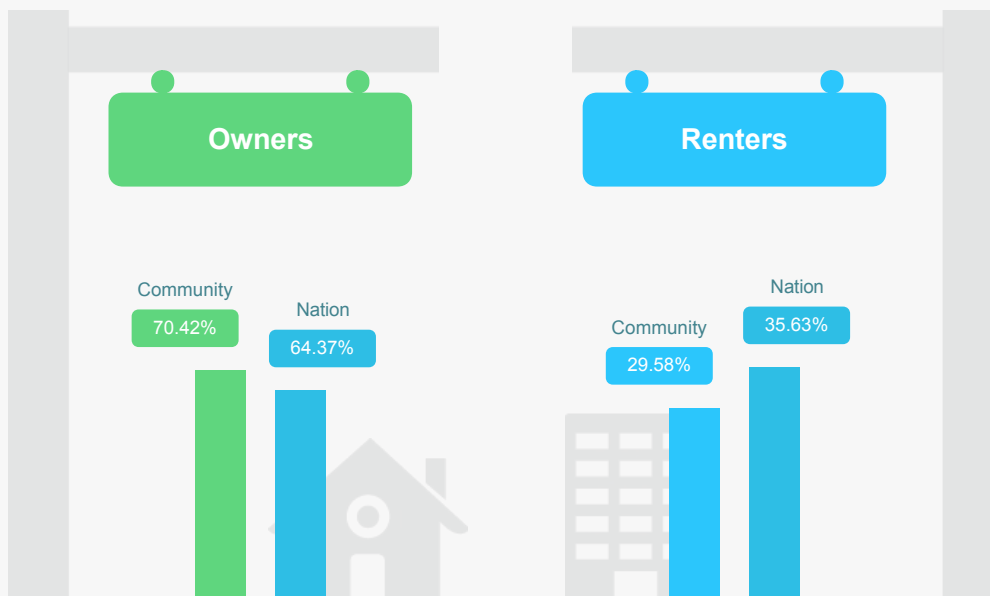

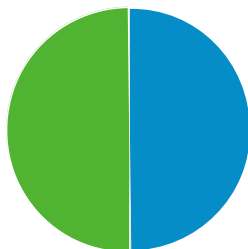

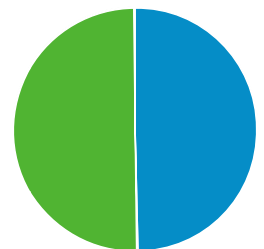

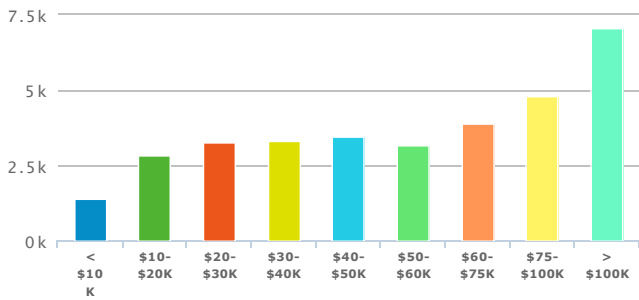

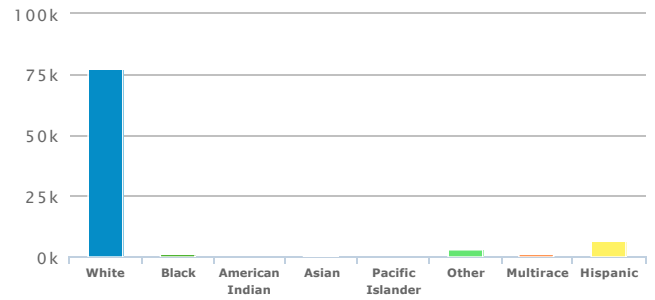

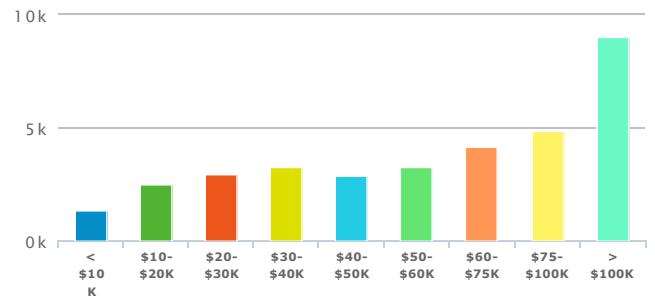

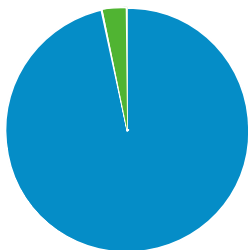

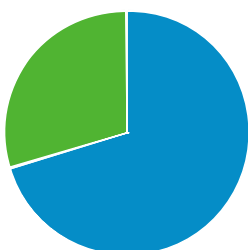

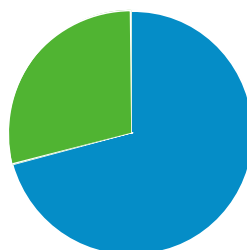
