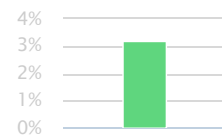

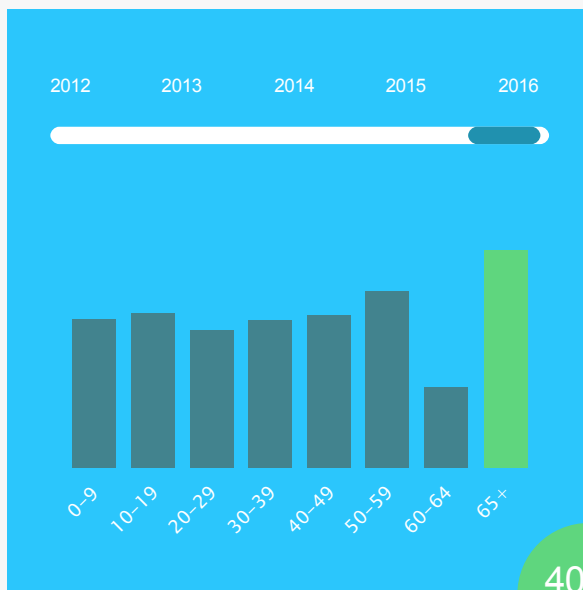
The total population of the County of Sauk County is 63,970. The median age is 40.30.

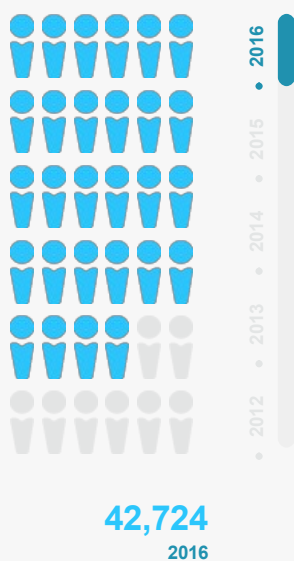

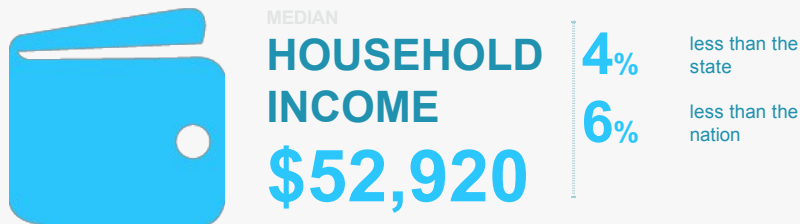

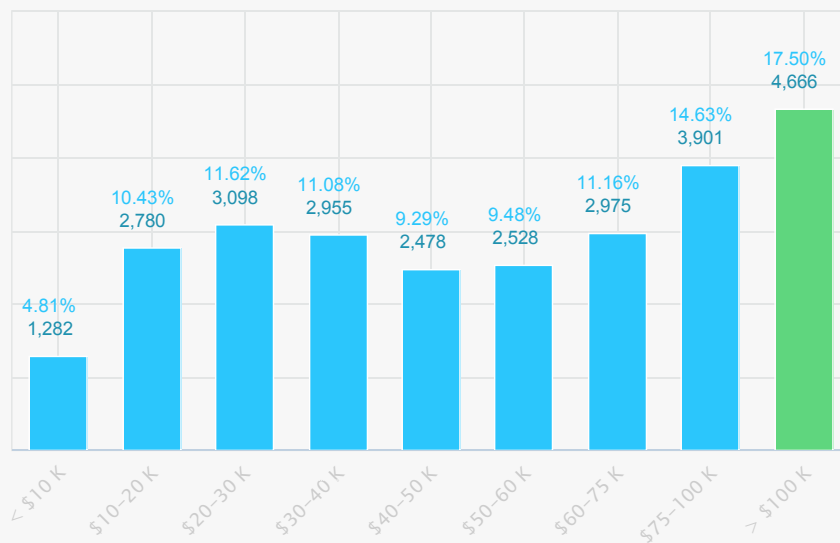
INCOME AND SPENDING

There are 131% more households who own their homes than there are renters.

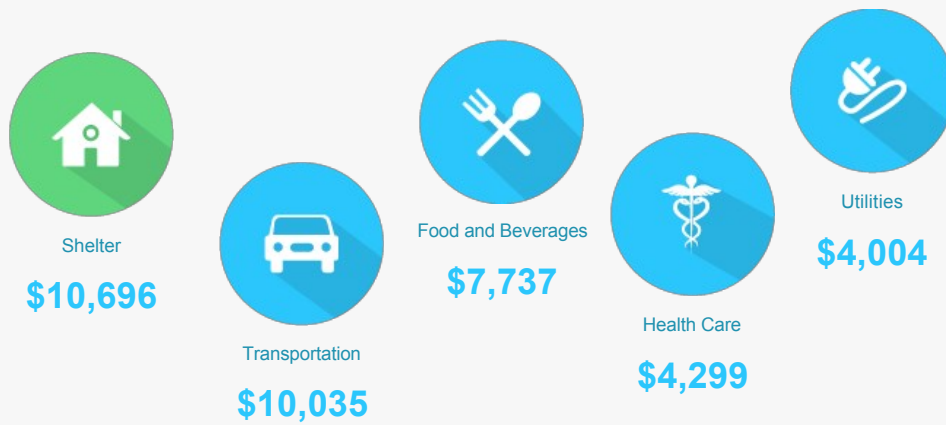


Income Distribution



How do people spend much of their money?

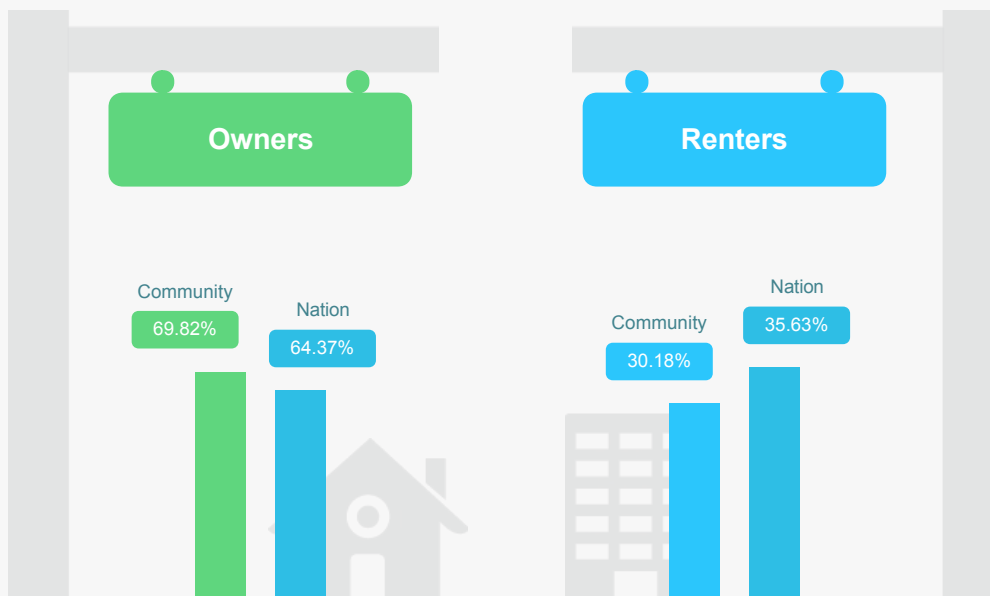

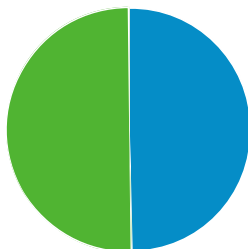

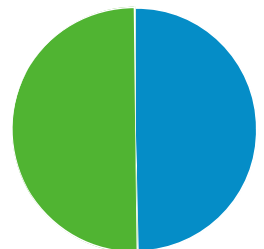

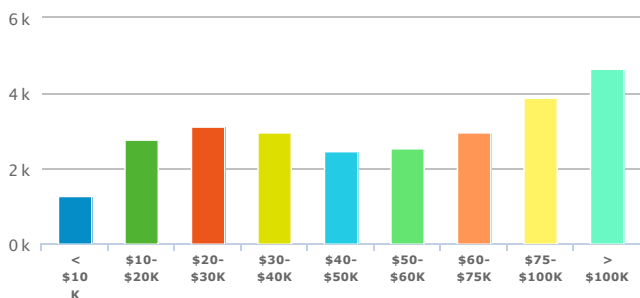

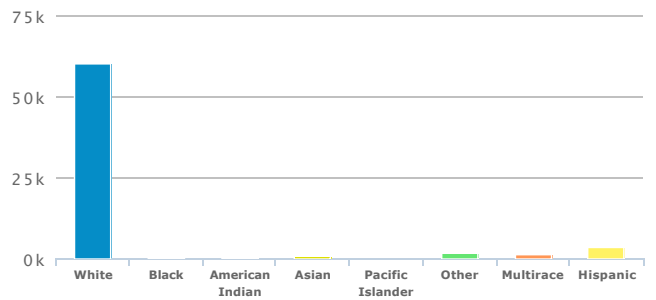

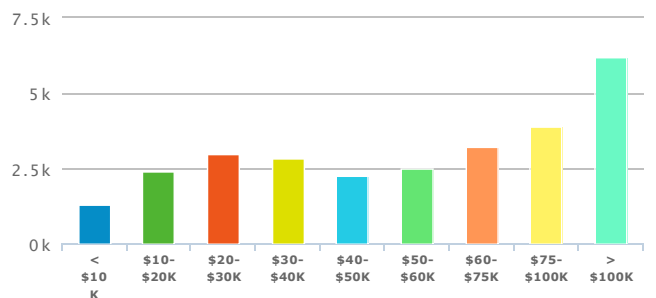

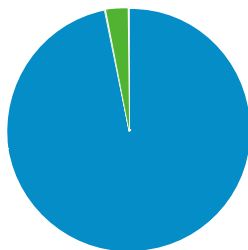

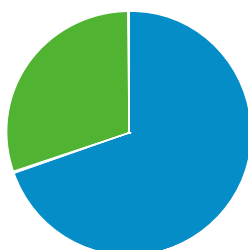
