


The total population of the Region of Madison Region Economic Partnership is 1,033,369. The median age is 39.87.







Which are the top 5 industries by jobs?






# INCOME AND SPENDING

Workers in Madison Region Economic Partnership earn a average yearly household income of \$57,242. 49.59% of the households earn more than the national average each year. There are 21% more households who own their homes than there are renters.




Income Distribution



## How do people spend much of their money?




















